Bongolo Hospital: A Key Initiative for the Gabonese Alliance Family

Location: The town of Lebamba in southwestern Gabon, not too far from the country of Congo Brazzaville (the Republic of the Congo)

Mission: Through the power of the Holy Spirit, reaching the lost for Jesus Christ by providing compassionate, professional medical care to all in need and equipping Christian medical professionals to extend this vision to all of Africa

Background: For over twenty years during the mid-20th century, Alliance international workers ran a small dispensary for treating the medical needs of people living in the Lebamba region. Building on that foundation, Bongolo Hospital was established in 1977, when a surgeon and two nurses arrived as full-time medical missionaries. Since that time, the hospital has grown into a 158-bed facility with four surgeons, two ophthalmologists, two internists, one pediatrician, one family practitioner/obstetrician, an anesthesiologist, and 70 ancillary personnel.

Medical Services: Surgery, adult medicine, maternity, pediatrics, HIV, TB, ophthalmology, dental, and emergency departments and clinics meet the medical needs of 1,000's of people each year.

The Goal of U. S. Personnel: To help the Bongolo Hospital staff and the Alliance Church of Gabon to assume full responsibility for the hospital, for loving and caring for the sick with devotion and expertise, and for leading as many of them as possible to faith in Jesus Christ

During the Coming Week

Thank God for the way He has used and blessed the Bongolo Hospital in meeting the medical, emotional, and spiritual needs of the Gabonese people, and ask for His continued favor upon this ministry. Also, ask that He would enable the Alliance Church of Gabon to assume full responsibility for its mission to provide compassionate, professional medical care and for spreading this type of work throughout Africa.
