Prayer Focus for the Week



In addition to providing compassionate, professional medical care each year to 1,000's of people living in the area surrounding Lebamba, Gabon, the Bongolo Hospital also instructs, mentors, and disciples medical professionals. In response to the long-standing shortage of qualified medical professionals in all African countries, Bongolo Hospital offers four training programs that are recognized across the continent for the quality of its graduates.

- 1. The School of Nursing: Because there are fewer doctors in Africa, the nurses must make clinical decisions and treat patients. Consequently, the students in this program are prepared more like nurse practitioners than their counterparts in the United States.
- 2. Anesthesia: This intensive, 2-year program prepares African nurses to capably provide safe anesthesia care for a variety of surgical procedures.
- **3. Surgical Residency:** This is a five-year program that prepares African physicians as general surgeons. It also offers its residents experiences in orthopedics, gynecology, otolaryngology, maxillo-facial surgery, plastic surgery, and anesthesia.
- 4. Ophthalmology: This advanced program trains African physicians as ophthalmological surgeons. These doctors become qualified to perform what we consider routine procedures, such as cataract surgeries, but also to surgical deal with eye problems that are unique to Africa.

Keep this in mind. The hospital, the clinics it runs, and the training schools are relatively small, function on limited budgets, often have difficulty in securing medical supplies, and recently have had to make major adjustments in an attempt to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

Nevertheless, praise God! The staff persists in fulfilling their dual calling: to provide Christ-centered, compassionate, professional medical care to the most needy and to equip Christian medical professionals to be a blessing wherever they serve in Africa.

During the coming week, ask God to continue enabling this Alliance ministry in fulfilling its mission for His glory and for the welfare of the Gabonese and other African people.
