Missions Prayer Focus for August







A large proportion of the evangelical believers in Paraguay are from immigrant backgrounds and represent different denominations: German (Mennonites and Lutherans). Brazilian (Pentecostals). Ukrainian (Baptists and Pentecostals) and Korean (Presbyterians). These

immigrant communities are sometimes inward-looking -isolated from each other and from the mainstream of national life. As a consequence, their churches minister only to the members of their respective congregations and have shown little interest in spreading the Gospel among their other Paraguayan neighbors.



Sadly, Alliance churches also have been inwardlooking and have been isolated from each other. Preoccupied with internal challenges, they have struggled to develop ministries that help their church members grow in knowledge and faith

and have depended upon Alliance IWs to spread the Gospel among non-believers outside their church walls.



Recently, however, there has been a growing awareness within the greater evangelical Church in Paraguay of its responsibility to reach out with the Gospel. Further, there have been some efforts to cooperate in this Gospel outreach across

denominational lines. During this coming week, please pray:

- for unity, health, and growth in Paraguay's C & M A churches: and
- for the followers of Jesus to unite across denominational lines in their efforts to train local leaders and to plant new communities of faith in Paraguay.
