aXcess workers *proclaim* the *Gospel* and *multiply* networks of *faith communities* among the *least reached*—whether those people are living in *other countries* or right here in the *United States*. aXcess *personnel* usually are drawn from *two categories* of workers:

- clergy who typically are involved in church-planting ministries, evangelism, theological training, and other activities related to the establishment and development of a network of national churches; or
- 2) vocational workers who typically are involved in educational, financial, medical, logistical, or community development work; business services; or vocationallydriven ministries related to the founding and growth of faith communities.

aXcess workers can be found in *seventy countries* around the world, often *working* in cooperation with *CAMA*, *marketplace ministries*, and *Envision* to advance the *cause* of *Christ*. Many of them serve in *countries* where they are *able* to operate as traditional *missionaries* and openly *proclaim* the *Gospel* and *plant churches*. Others, however, serve in *places* where either it is *illegal* to overtly *share* the Gospel or where the *Gospel* is faced with a great deal of *hostility*. In those place, our *aXcess* workers utilize *creative means* to advance the *Gospel* message.

During the coming week, let us **thank** God for the **men** and **women** who **serve** as **aXcess workers** and **ask** for His **continued blessing** upon **them** and their **ministries**.
