April Prayer Focus – Burkina Faso

From our missionaries in Burkina Faso, Andrew and Esther Schaeffer.

When cities experience rapid growth, housing becomes a problem. The city where we serve has pretty much doubled in the last ten years. Our city churches have targeted areas on the outskirts of our city known as the non-lotis, areas not yet zoned for housing. These neighborhoods seem to spring up overnight and keep squeezing in more and more people. Another way to look at the non-lotis is to see it as an in-between neighborhood. People have moved out of the village, but haven't yet moved into the established communities of the city.

Our churches see these parts of the city as areas of opportunities to plant new churches and serve the poor that are struggling to get work, housing, and support a family. Andrew and I come alongside to help with projects like schools, wells, and a church building. I teach Bible studies in several of these neighborhoods.

After Bible study this past week, a woman asked to speak with me. Four years earlier she had just delivered a baby and had lost a lot of blood. She was at our local hospital hardly conscious. Her husband came to the hospital chapel and it happened to be a day when our team was there. We quickly went to her bedside and began to pray and also paid for the medical care she needed. "I know that your prayers made a difference and now our whole family is following Christ." They became part of the initial group of believers in this community.

We are thankful to be a part of bringing the Good News of the Lord Jesus to these in-between neighborhoods of our city. We are also thankful to serve a risen Savior. We have such a wonderful message of hope to share. Thank you for supporting us and allowing us to do this in the non-lotis areas of our city.

OFFERING ENVELOPE DESIGNATIONS

General Fund – All income that is not designated otherwise goes to our general fund to pay for all the ongoing needs of our ministry – salaries, utilities, insurance, Sunday School, AWANA, AYF, district expense, upkeep, etc. *General Fund

Missions – All giving (whether or not you made a “Faith Promise”) marked “missions” or “**Great Commission Fund**” goes to the National Office to fund the worldwide sharing of the Gospel. *Great Commission Fund

Building Fund – Special improvements. * Building Fund

Extension – These monies are for planting new churches in our Western PA district where a Bible preaching church is needed. *included in Other Missions

Pastoral Support – Any funds received for this category will be moved to General Fund

Benevolent Fund – This is used to minister to those who approach us for help with special needs in times of financial crises. *included in Other Missions

CAMA – The CMA’s world wide famine relief. CAMA stands for Compassion and Mercy Associates and has 30 relief and development workers serving in eight countries. *included in Other Missions

Other Missions – This is used to help other ministries not mentioned above such as – Crossroads, Food Bank, Gideons, Alliance Women, Tim Claybaugh, Grosseohme’s, Murphy’s, Hatcher’s, Eichelman’s & Envision..etc. To give please write the name on the giving envelop.

How to cut brownies for the LIFE 2022 Chicken BBQ

1. Use 9" x 13" pan
2. Bake brownies as directed on box (**NO NUTS!**).
3. While still warm, use a plastic knife to cut the brownies.
4. Cut thru the middle of the pan of brownies both length-wise and width-wise, making four rectangles.
5. Now cut each rectangle into three rows cutting across the pan width-wise.
6. You should have six rows of two brownies which equals twelve brownies.
7. Cool brownies.
8. Place 1 brownie into a snack bag and close tight.
9. Bring to the church. They are now ready to be packed in the meal containers.
