

January Prayer Focus – Dominican Republic



Size:	18,792 sq. mi.
Population:	11,000,000
Christians:	98%
Main Religion:	Catholic 95%

The Alliance has had an active presence in the Dominican Republic since the mid 1960s when Dominicans living in New York, along with other Hispanic immigrants, sacrificially gave of their time and resources to take the Christ-centered message of the C&MA to their homeland. The church took root and grew, even with the absence of trained pastors or international workers.

In the 1980s, The Alliance sent full-time international workers to the country to work alongside Dominican believers to provide much-needed leadership and theological training and to expand the church into people groups with little evangelical presence.

Today, Alliance workers are involved in a variety of ministries, in many cases working alongside Dominican believers to build Christian communities throughout the country. Creative strategies such as Marriage Encounter, relational evangelism, and youth and family outreaches are among many different approaches being used to share Jesus' love and expand His Kingdom among urban professionals, one of the least reached groups in the Dominican Republic. The ultimate goal is to multiply strong communities of believers throughout the country who will impact their nation and the world. National Church

The C&MA National Church of the Dominican Republic: 37 organized churches (25 members and above), 35 unorganized churches (below 25 members), 11 preaching points (small groups), 19 ordained ministers, 14 pastors, 28 licensed workers, 4 local Dominican missionary church planters.

COMMUNION INFORMATION

Here at HCMA, we practice 'open communion.' What that means is, if you are a Christ-follower of any church background, we welcome you warmly into this ordinance.

What is communion?

- It is a step of faith acknowledging what Jesus has done.
 (John 13)
- it is a ceremony of remembrance of what Jesus has done.
 (1 Corinthians 11:23-26)
- It is a celebration of what Jesus will do. (Acts 1:11)
- Finally, it is also an act of obedience. (1 Corinthians 11:24)

Who is communion for?

In a word, Christians. Anyone can eat a cracker and drink a little grape juice, but that is not communion. Communion is far greater than a 'snack'.

Communion has its root in the idea of *charis* (care-us). The Greek word for grace. We celebrate the grace of God when we celebrate communion.

Things to consider before taking communion:

Your Relationship with Jesus. If you do not yet have a saving faith in Jesus, I would recommend letting the plate pass you by, or better yet, place your faith in Jesus right now!

Your Relationship with Others. In 1 Corinthians 11:28, we are told to examine ourselves. In Matthew 5:23, we are told to ensure we quickly solve relationship issues. If you have problems with others please, just let the plate pass you by—or again, better yet, make things right prior to taking communion.

HEALING INFORMATION

As part of the Christian & Missionary Alliance, adhering to the Four-Fold Gospel, we believe that Jesus is not only our Savior, our Sanctifier, our Coming King—but also Jesus is our Healer.

In the gospels, we see Jesus navigating His journey in and around Jerusalem. We see His earthly ministry involved many miracles, all of which are amazing. Amongst these many miracles, we see Jesus doing healings. He would heal people of many illnesses:

Matthew 12:15 Matthew 14:14 Matthew 15:30 Matthew 21:14 Luke 4:40 Luke 9:11 Mark 3:10 Plus many, many more

Perhaps one of the most important passages is found in Isaiah 53:5, "But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed."

This passage finds its completion in the New Testament. Specifically, Matthew 8:14, "14 When Jesus came into Peter's home, He saw his mother-in-law lying sick in bed with a fever. 15 He touched her hand, and the fever left her; and she got up and waited on Him. 16 When evening came, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed; and He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were ill. 17 This was to fulfill what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet: "HE HIMSELF TOOK OUR INFIRMITIES AND CARRIED AWAY OUR DISEASES."

We also see in Acts, that healing continued because of Jesus (Acts 3). And in the book of James, we are told to call for the elders if we are sick. They will then pray over you and anoint you with oil (James 5:14). Also in the book of James, we are told that the prayer of a righteous person can accomplish great things, and that we are to confess our sins—and any sins confessed, will be forgiven (James 5:15-16).

So, if you come to the altar today, come prepared to answer two questions:

- 1) What are you specifically asking the Lord to heal you from?
- 2) Is there anything that might keep the Lord from accomplishing this? ***We just ask that if you do not come to the altar, that you sit and quietly pray for those who do come forward.***

FAMILY MATTERS

Answers to your questions...

We've moved and need to find a new home church. We looked online and visited several. I like one particular church, and my husband prefers a different one. Any advice on how to resolve this issue?

ANSWER:

Here are a few principles to consider—especially if you and your spouse are having trouble with this decision:

1. Husbands have a spiritual leadership rolewithin limits. Generally, the biblical standard is that the husband has a responsibility to lead spiritually at home. Whenever possible, the wife is to respect and follow that leadership rather than openly rebel against it or passively undercut his efforts. The husband has a sacred duty not to trample on or ignore his wife's needs, preferences and feelings. If a husband is "leading" his wife into

churches or practices that are heretical or cultic, of course, the wife has to refuse to participate. Her first allegiance is to God and His truth. Most of the time, however, differences in churches are not that extreme.

2. Give your relationship priority. God doesn't want a dispute over church to tear your marriage apart. Try to compromise in a way that both of you can live with. Keep looking for a church that provides for the spiritual growth of both spouses. Expect that both of you are seeking what God wants for you.

3. Try creative alternatives. You might try the "mix and match" approach. Many churches offer both a "traditional" and "contemporary" service. Some couples attend a Saturday night "contemporary" service and also occasionally a Sunday morning "traditional" service at the


same church.

Some couples decide to "solve" this problem by skipping church altogether. Clearly this is not a decision God would want for them. Scripture states that Christians are not to abandon fellowship with other believers.

If you are at an impasse over this issue, don't despair. Keep praying with each other that God will give you a solution. Examine your motives, asking yourself why you find it so hard to accommodate your spouse. If deeper issues are preventing reconciliation, seek out Christian counseling if necessary.

Most couples, if they're seeking to please God and not just themselves, eventually find a church where both spouses are satisfied.

NEW YEAR, NEW PURPOSE IN YOUR MARRIAGE

The New Year tends to be a time of resolutions and new beginnings. What if this year we spent time making resolutions for the improvement of our marriage relationship?

Amid the busyness of life, we often forget that there is an actual purpose for which God united us with our spouse. The power in your union results from what God does in marriage when He takes two individuals and makes them one. He unites couples to do together what they could never do alone.

TEACHING CHILDREN TO BE PRO-LIFE

As parents, the Lord has entrusted us with the precious life of another human being, one who was formed and fashioned in the image of their Creator.

How does one go about teaching that precious little one to value the uniqueness of all life? Does instilling pro-life values into our children rest solely in advocation for the preborn, or does it expand the gamut of all human life the Lord has created?

Teaching our children to be pro-life is most impactful when we model the concept through consistent and intentional actions. Some of the building blocks to this process are instilling within them the truth that God has a purpose and plan for each life He creates. And teaching your child to be genuinely pro-life will require sacrifice from you.

Being pro-life is not merely stating you believe all life is valuable. Neither is it only voting for those political candidates who say they are pro-life. Demonstrating you are pro-life, and deeply imparting this value to your children, is best accomplished by backing up your words with intentional actions, even when it feels inconvenient.

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

James 2:14-17

If anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and truth.

1 John 3:17-18

Teaching our children to be genuinely pro-life requires intentional and oftentimes inconvenient actions. As with all things, it is imperative to look at the example Jesus gave us while here on earth. Christ served others relentlessly, and ultimately, He willingly surrendered His life so we could have eternal life.
